MINUTES

CITY COUNCIL MEETING TUESDAY, MAY 6, 2003

CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS 10001 N.W. 87 AVENUE

- 1. Call to Order: Chairman Garcia called the meeting to order at 7:36 p.m.
- 2. **Roll Call:** Present were Chairman Luciano Garcia, Councilman Rolando Piña, and Councilman Manuel Zardon. Also present were Mayor Yioset De La Cruz and City Attorney Charles A. Citrin.
- 3. **Invocation:** Chairman Garcia gave the invocation.
- 4. **Pledge of Allegiance:** Mayor De La Cruz led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 5. **Deletions/Emergency Additions:** None were offered.
- 6. **Review of Minutes: April 15, 2003:** Chairman Garcia made a motion to approve the minutes of April 15, 2003, seconded by Councilman Zardon. The motion passed unanimously.
- 7. **Temporary council member appointment by the Mayor pursuant to Section 15 (b) of the City Charter:** Mayor Yioset De La Cruz recommended Mr. Jorge Gutierrez to serve as a temporary appointment on the Council. He commended Mr. Guttierez on his hard work and service to the City as a member of the Planning and Zoning Board and was confident he would continue to serve the community well as a Councilman. Pursuant to the requirements of City Charter Section 15, Chairman Garcia made a motion to approve the appointment of Mr. Guttierez, seconded by Councilman Zardon. The motion was unanimously approved by individualized voice vote. (Vote 3-0)
- 8. Presentation of Proclamation: "International Support for the Cuban Opposition Day": Councilman Rolando Piña presented a proclamation on behalf of the City to Mr. Miguel Garrote for his organization's involvement in working for freedom in Cuba. Councilman Piña offered his comments on the state of affairs in Cuba, as did Mr. Garrote.

- 9. Recommendation of bid for the construction of an addition to the Human Services Recreational Building (Senior Center): Mr. Rey Regalado, Building Official, came forward and offered his recommendation to award the contract for the construction of an addition to the Senior Center to BM Construction at a cost of \$81,875.00. Mr. Regalado made reference to his memo which noted BM Construction as the lowest responsible bidder. Mr. Citrin noted a memo provided to the Council by Mr. Arturo Ruiz, Director of Administration, which gave the chronological details of the bidding process for this project. A motion to instruct Mr. Citrin to draft a resolution awarding the contract was made by Chairman Garcia, seconded by Councilman Zardon. The motion passed unanimously.
- 10. Request of expenditures for road construction project N.W. 92 Avenue at N.W. 114 Street: Mr. Joe Lopez, Public Works Director, addressed the Council and offered a description of the proposed project which will include drainage and the construction of 330 linear feet of roadway from N.W. 92 Avenue between N.W. 114 Street and "Vincenza PUD" to the North. The project costs are estimated to be \$ 35,082.00 and will be done by Department forces excluding paving. Chairman made a motion to approve the expenditures, seconded by Councilman Zardon. The motion passed unanimously.
- 11. Approval of 3PS retail alcohol beverage license for Old Parr Corporation/Palmetto Liquors, 7916 N.W. 103 Street Hialeah Gardens, FL: Mr. Morton Goodice, receiver for Old Parr Corporation and Mr. Antonio Guzman the applicant came forward. Mr. Goodice explained that as a result of a dispute between the corporate partners, the Circuit Court had appointed him to serve as receiver for the liquor store. He went on to explain that Mr. Guzman, who is one of the partners, has properly renewed the alcohol beverage license with the State. Mr. Guzman is presently seeking to obtain an occupational license from the City in order to reopen the business. After review of the City's requirements for this type of licensure and a favorable recommendation from staff, Chairman Garcia offered a motion to approve, seconded by Councilman Zardon. The motion passed unanimously.

12. **Proposed Resolutions:**

A) A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH GARDENS, FLORIDA AUTHORIZING THE ENTERING INTO AMENDMENT NUMBER ONE TO THE CONTRACT BETWEEN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY AND THE CITY OF HIALEAH GARDENS PROVIDING FOR THE UTILIZATION OF FUNDS GRANTED AFTER THE EXPIRATION OF THE C.D.B.G. FY 1999 CONTRACT FOR THE HYDRA SAMARI EMERGENCY ACCESS ROAD PROJECT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mr. Citrin read the full title of the resolution into the record. Maria Joffee, City Clerk offered a brief explanation of the need for this resolution which would serve to extend the 1999 O.C.E.D. contract with the City has with Miami-Dade County. Chairman Garcia made a motion to approve, seconded by Councilman Zardon. The motion was unanimously approved.

B) A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH GARDENS, FLORIDA AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF TWO (2) TORO Z255 RADIUS LAWNMOWERS AND ONE (1) TORO WORKMAN 1100 UTILITY VEHICLE; AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATE CITY OFFICIALS TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH TESCO SOUTH D/B/A HECTOR TURF; UTILIZING EXISTING STATE AND MUNICIPAL CONTRACTS; WAIVING COMPETITIVE BIDDING; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mr. Citrin read the full title of the resolution into the record. Mr. Raymond Garcia, Park's Director came forward and gave his recommendation for purchasing the equipment via state contracts which would afford the City the best pricing available. Chairman Garcia made a motion to approve, seconded by Councilman Zardon. The motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Citrin read the full title of the ordinance into the record. Ms. Sharon Aylward, surveyor for the project was present for the applicant. Chairman Garcia stated that this was a first reading for the record, and as such an opportunity for public input would be provided upon second reading. He then made a motion to approve, seconded by Councilman Zardon. The motion was unanimously approved by individualized voice vote. (Vote 4-0)

FOLIO # 27-2032-002-0070 PROVIDING FOR CONDITIONS; PROVIDING FOR EFFECTIVE DATE. (Location: N.W. 99 Avenue and Frontage Road) (T.R.C. Vote 5-0) (P & Z Vote 4-0)

Mr. Citrin read the full title of the ordinance into the record. No one came forward for the applicant. Chairman Garcia stated that this was a first reading for the record, and as such an opportunity for public input would be provided upon second reading. He then made a motion to approve, seconded by Councilman Zardon with Councilman Guttierez voting in favor and Councilman Piña against. The motion was approved by individualized voice vote. (Vote 3-1)

He offered his appreciation to State Representative Ralph Arza for his efforts in securing the State funding which provided the means for the project. Mayor De La Cruz also commented on the new County bus route which would be providing service to areas in the City and the new landscaping project the City had undertaken to beautify numerous thoroughfares and parks. He concluded by inviting everyone to the Mother's Day celebration on Friday May 9, at the Senior Center.
