# **MINUTES**

CITY OF HIALEAH GARDENS TUESDAY, February 20, 2018 CITY COUNCIL CHAMBERS 10001 NW 87 AVENUE

- **1. Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order at 7:33 p.m. with Councilman Rolando Piña serving as Chairman.
- 2. Roll Call: Present were Councilman Elmo L. Urra, Councilman Jorge Gutierrez, Councilman Jorge A. Merida, and Councilman Rolando Piña. Also present were Mayor Yioset De La Cruz and Assistant City Attorney Aida Martinez-Ruiz. Chairman Luciano Garcia and City Attorney Charles A. Citrin were absent.
- **3. Invocation:** Councilman Gutierrez gave the invocation.
- 4. Pledge of Allegiance: Mayor Yioset De La Cruz led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 5. Deletions/Emergency Additions: None were offered.
- **6. Review of Minutes: January 16, 2018** Chairman Piña made a motion to approve the minutes of January 16, 2018. The motion was approved unanimously.
- 7. Public Comments: None were offered.

# 8. Presentation of Distinguished Public Service Awards to Mrs. Sharon Gonzalez, Principal of West Hialeah Gardens Elementary School and Mr. Louis J. Algaze, Principal of Hialeah Gardens Senior High School.

Mayor De La Cruz commented that the City is very proud of its schools and that he believes Hialeah Gardens has some of the best schools in the County, and some of the best Principals, Staff, and Administrations in the County. On behalf of the City he acknowledged Ms. Maritza Jimenez, Principal of the Year from Hialeah Gardens Middle School who was in attendance and officially recognized Principal Sharon Gonzalez of West Hialeah Gardens Elementary School and Principal Louis J. Algaze of Hialeah Gardens Senior High School for their contributions to education. Mayor De La Cruz stated he believes that helping our schools and our kids will make the City better; he personally thanked the recipients on behalf of the City and its residents and presented them each with a Distinguished Public Service Award.

Mayor De La Cruz then made a statement concerning the epidemic of mass shootings and the most recent incident at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School. The City has created a School Safety Team together with its Police Officers and will be working closely with the administration of every school to provide as much safety as possible to students. Hialeah Gardens PD will be specially training its officers during Spring Break in order to familiarize them with every school campus and will be assigning officers to every school/Principal to help track suspicious social media posts. Officers have been and will be trained in fast-response tactics to directly minimize damage at public schools and avoid having to rely on a delayed SWAT team response in the case of a threat. He concluded by thanking the Principals and teachers in attendance for all of their work and dedication.

9. Presentation of the Strategic Miami Area Rapid Transit (SMART) plan: Ms. Aileen Boucle, Executive Director, Miami-Dade Transportation Planning Organization.

Ms. Aileen Boucle came forward and began the presentation for the SMART plan that was adopted by the TPO and their efforts for funding the 30-year plan. A PowerPoint presentation including a video was shown to explain the details of the program. The goal is to meet with each municipality to brief them on the SMART plan, obtain input, and request a resolution of support to include the City as part of their funding application. Ms. Boucle concluded and offered to answer questions or concerns.

Chairman Pina asked if there was any future planning to bring better mass transit specifically closer to Hialeah Gardens because it was not included on the corridor map. Ms. Boucle answered that yes, there was, and that the map they were looking showed the buildout of the base network which was originally contemplated when the People's Transportation Tax was approved by the voters. This proposal seeks to complete building the base network. In addition to the principal SMART Plan, they are proposing SMART Plan 2 and SMART Plan 3. SP2

is the connection with the Northwest quadrant of the County in which Hialeah Gardens is included so that there is an integrated transit system. SP3 is looking at every major East-West arterial in the County to connect it with the larger system. Councilman Pina then asked what the green dotted lines on the map represent. Ms. Boucle answered that they represent an express bus service that would utilize an express lane.

The Mayor asked about the plan to spend \$30 million for the next thirty years. Ms. Boucle confirmed that they are allocating \$30 million of funding starting 2023, which would count towards the local commitment. The Mayor asked if the plan was fully funded at the County level. Ms. Boucle answered no, that this is the first wave of funding and that Federal funding requires a 50% funding partnership, thus the goal is to maximize state and federal funding. Mayor De La Cruz also inquired as to how many miles will be added to the transit system, to which Ms. Boucle responded that approximately 50 miles will be added.

Councilman Gutierrez asked whether each corridor would see expansions of the Metrorail specifically, or of other types of rapid transit. Ms. Boucle answered that each corridor might have a slightly different transit technology. Many different technological proposals are on the table, but they want to find the best one, the one that's going to move the maximum amount of people within a corridor that they can afford to build.

The Mayor and the Council thanked Ms. Boucle and this concluded the discussion.

# 10. Proposed Resolution:

A) RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH GARDENS. FLORIDA. APPROVING THE ENTERING INTO AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF HIALEAH GARDENS AND MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA IN SUBSTANTIALLY THE FORM AS ATTACHED HERETO AS EXHIBIT "A", RELATING TO THE COUNTY'S PROCUREMENT PROCEDURES WHEN IMPLEMENTING THE BUILDING BETTER COMMUNITIES BOND PROGRAM AND FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND THE CITY CLERK, AS ATTESTING WITNESS, ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, TO ENTER INTO THE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT AND TAKE ANY OTHER ACTION IN FURTHERANCE THEREOF: PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS: AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mayor De La Cruz explained that this is a grant that was secured years ago from the County for \$300,000. The City is in the final stages of receiving the money and this is one of the steps that has to be taken. The funds will go to Westland Gardens Park/Botanical Gardens bathroom facilities and for a passive park.

Chairman Pina made a motion to approve the resolution, seconded by Councilman Merida. The motion passed unanimously. **(4-0)**
